Why use Social Media?

Great way to:

- Communicate with others
- Keep in touch with family and friends
- Make long distance friendships
- Maintain relationships when unable to leave a home or care center

Reduces feelings of isolation and loneliness. You feel connected.



Facebook


- Considered the top social media platform.
- FREE!!! Account required.
- Connect to friends, family members, coworkers, businesses, events, etc.
- Post comments, pictures or videos.
- Default Privacy settings are WIDE OPEN
- Publicly owned company. You are the commodity, not the customer. Be cautious of sharing too much information.
- You may select strong privacy, but Facebook maintains a full history and multiple backups of your "likes", friends, etc.
- Be cautious of online quizzes and games
- Keep pieces of identity separate. Individual details in different comments can be combined to generate identifiable information.

11 Facebook profile privacy tips

- 1. Lock down your profile
- 2. Limit who can see old posts
- 3. Post to selected friends
- 4. HIDE YOUR AGE and other personal information
- 5. Consider not setting your relationship status
- 6. Hide your Friend list
- 7. Limit Friend requests
- 8. Blocking
- 9. Remove location information
- 10. Keep photos private
- 11. If creating an Event, use "Invitation Only" setting



- FREE. Account required.
- Owned by Facebook. Can connect using your Facebook account.
- Share/view pictures and short videos
- Connect with friends or interests
- Default privacy settings are WIDE OPEN
- Can "like" postings by others. Can share others' postings but only privately.





- Short "tweets" maximum 140 characters
- Able to "retweet" or share someone else's "tweet". Comments can be added to your retweet.
- Able to comment on someone's tweet by referencing the account name with an @ sign, e.g. @Poorjanedoe
- Great source of current news
- Great source of fake news too. Be cautious.
- BE CAUTIOUS: 1 out of every 3 accounts are fake
- Many many many comments are Memes. And memes are more likely to be retweeted which many Twitter users love. They feel popular.

What's a Meme?

Pronounced "meem"



A Meme is a joke or comment about a specific topic/photo that goes viral

Oscars 2020: Billie Eilish saw herself on a large side screen as the cameras zoomed in on her face. Almost immediately, people posted memes using this screenshot.





- FREE

- Requires a Google account to <u>post</u> videos.
- Best privacy setting for your uploaded videos is "Unlisted" Not searchable or publically available
- YouTube owned by Google.
- YouTube keeps history of your searches. Offers suggestions for videos to watch next.
















- FREE requires account

- A great way to find and 'save' ideas for reference





| S | SAFE: Keep your stuff locked down. |

| M | MEET: Do you really know who you are meeting? |
| A | ACCEPTING: Files you can trust and files you can't. |
| R | RELIABLE: Trust, but <u>VERIFY</u> any information |
| Т | TELL SOMEONE: (kid advice) - Nasty words, nosy people, and bad advice |

Don't Feed The Trolls!



- Troll a person who intentionally incites anger and sows division for their own entertainment
- Trolls feed off getting a rise out of people
- DO NOT react in any way. Ignore if possible, block the troll, or logout
- The core of trolling is having fun at the expense of other people
- Examples of trolling:
 - Pretending to be someone to trick someone else
 - Making outlandish and intentionally inflammatory statements to get a rise out of people

Dealing with Harassment


- Block first, ask questions never
- You can't UNSAY something online
- You don't want to become a meme
- Some people just want to be toxic
- If someone threatens you, document it and report it
- If you are worried, document EVERYTHING
